COMING SOON......NEW HFL SERVICE

The HFL **Complaint Investigations Service** will be launched around March/April 2024.

It will offer schools and settings the option of commissioning an independent investigation of formal complaints at Stage 1 or Stage 2 of the school's complaints process.

The new service will also offer other complaints-related resources upon request, including flowcharts, toolkits, suggested templates and webinars.

Key benefits:

 By being able to commission an external investigation, school leaders should have more time to focus on other priorities, such as school improvement and performance.

- Spending less time dealing with complaints should help to improve staff morale and wellbeing.
- It should also help to improve staff and governor recruitment and retention.
- The option of the new service presents a way forward in cases where the relationship between the complainant and the school may be strained or where cases have reached an impasse.

EXCLUSIONS TRAINING – LAW AND PROCESS; GETTING IT RIGHT

In March, HFL teamed up with Tees Law to deliver a session for governors "Exclusions Training – Law and Process; getting it right" which was extremely well received by all the delegates that attended. We are following this up with a headteacher/deputy head only session that will take place on Monday 24th June, 9.30am – 4.30pm in person at Hertfordshire Development Centre, Robertson House, Six Hills Way, Stevenage and will be delivered by Polly Kerr, Legal Director, Tees Law. Exclusions Training – Law and Process; getting it right –

Headteacher/deputy head only session.

With an increase in Governor Discipline Committee (GDC) decisions being challenged at Independent Review Panel (IRP) it is becoming increasingly important for Headteachers to be supported with additional knowledge with regards to the Exclusions process. Exclusion rates are increasing in Herts as are the numbers of IRP hearings with significant disadvantage having been caused to children and young people as a result.

The face to face, full day training will support Headteachers in their role and help them understand the importance of getting it right. The training will focus on the law and process around exclusions.

The session will be a full day at Hertfordshire Development Centre, Robertson House, Six Hills Way, Stevenage.

The morning session will cover: The Decision to Exclude – What happens next?

- An overview of the statutory scheme to review.
- Governors' Disciplinary Committee
- Headteacher and Governors' duties
- Preparing for the meeting
- Running Order
- Considering the evidence. What is the governors' role – the standard of proof?
- Making a decision

The afternoon session will cover: Independent Review Panel

- IRP's duties
- Preparing for the review
- Running Order
- Considering the evidence. What is the IRP's role the standard of proof?
- Making a decision what options are available to the IRP and what does this mean in practice.

MODERN GOVERNOR UPDATE



We have recently launched two new modules to support School Budgeting which we know is an incredibly challenging area for schools. As the expectations for maintained schools and trusts are different, we have created two modules covering monthly budgeting to support each setting type; Academy management account and Monthly budget monitoring.

We also have the following modules which cover all the financial elements you will be reviewing this term: **SVFS**, **Academies financial management** and **Financial management for governors**.

We have updated our **GDPR** module to reflect the extensive breath this topic covers for schools and the legislative expectation under KCSIE. The module will support you to understand why GDPR applies to settings, what the responsibilities are, how to be complaint and key questions you can ask as a governor to ensure compliance in this area plus further resources.

We have made an update to our Converting To Academy Status module to reflect the changes to the processes school undertake when converting. This is renamed as **Joining a Trust.**

NB All modules will be updated to reflect the changes in the recently published Governance Guides (Maintained school and academy trusts).

Coming soon is a new bite sized module to guide you through the platform features including completing a module. This will support governors who have yet to find their way around the subscription and guide users to get the best from the training available. We will confirm once this has been launched.

This year has also seen the launch of the new DAR (Designated Administrator Role) feature which will enable a nominated user to have an overview of the school/ trust board on Modern Governor including:

- Personal profile data set up under the school board, including name, email address and date user last accessed
- Training records for each user, showing named module completions






SFVS RETURN

The SFVS return is a mandatory annual requirement from the Department for Education (DfE). The deadline for the submission of this to the Local Authority was 29th March 2024.

To ensure that you comply with the DfE requirements please make sure that you have submitted your completed SFVS return to SIAS (sias@hertfordshire.gov.uk) in word format. SIAS will continue to post any further updates on the Grid and via Bulletins should any further changes be announced.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

Effective monitoring of Health & Safety in schools

The governing body have a key part to play in tackling risk aversion, providing a wider sense of perspective and helping the school to get the balance right on managing risk.

We'd expect Governors to work in close partnership with the head teacher and senior leadership team to identify priority areas for monitoring and support which should be aligned to the school's risk profile.

In-particular whether policy expectations in higher risk areas, such as fire, asbestos, legionella and general premises compliance are being met.

There are updated versions (Oct 23) now on the Grid for the school site inspection checklist (intended to be undertaken by school staff inhouse on a termly / 6 monthly cycle) and the annual Governor / SLT monitoring checks which together can form part of an overall strategy in order schools can demonstrate that the principles of **HSG 65 'Managing for Health and Safety'** is in place. These templates should be adapted to suit each school's environment / risks.

DFE, HCC AND OTHER NATIONAL UPDATES

H&S COMPLIANCE TRACKING

Governors and senior leaders should maintain clear oversight of key H&S areas and be able to track actions arising to completion.

To aid with this we have an Excel compliance tracker that details the expected cycle times for H&S inspection, testing and maintenance as well as other document reviews (H&S policy, COSHH inventory etc.) https://thegrid.org.uk/Restricted-assets/h-s-compliance-tracker-sep-23.xlsx

There are of course a number of other ways this can be achieved be that via

H&S software, the DfE compliance tracker as part of GEMS (Good estate management for schools) etc. https://assets.publishing.service.gov.uk/media/5f84b003e90e077041376d18/Compliance_Tracker.xlsx ,whichever tool is being used by the school governors should be able to easily get assurance that routine H&S inspection and checks are in place.

NEW GOVERNANCE GUIDES PUBLISHED

The Department for Education (DfE) has published **2 new governance guides,** to replace the Governance Handbook - its essential reference guide to the roles and duties of governing boards.

There are **no new requirements**, so your board doesn't need to do anything right now, except to be aware of, and able to access, the right guide for your school type (they've been split into maintained and academy guides).

OFSTED SCHOOL INSPECTION HANDBOOK UPDATES



The School Inspection Handbook was updated in January 2024.

There is now a focus on leaders' wellbeing

- Inspector training on mental health awareness
- Enhanced clarity on inspectors' conduct (para 9 of School inspection handbook)
- Check on headteacher's wellbeing in the inspection planning conversation (90 minute call) (para 96)
- Clarity around who can attend meetings (paras 22 & 94)
- Confidentiality of judgments and timing of publication of reports

Changes have been made regarding deferrals, concerns about inspections and pausing an inspection

- Clearer guidelines on how schools can request deferrals (paras 89-92) and what considerations are taken into account
- Opportunity to raise concerns during or after an inspection
- Clearer guidelines re pausing an inspection

TEACHER WORKLOAD REDUCTION TASK FORCE

"The Workload Reduction Taskforce was remitted with agreeing recommendations on specific areas by the end of October and we are pleased to confirm acceptance of these initial recommendations, noting the Government's additional decisions below. These recommendations are an important milestone of the work of the Taskforce and along with the final set of recommendations in March, they will help support the Government's ambition to reduce working hours for teachers and leaders by five hours per week within three years, enabling them to focus on what matters most – high quality teaching."


- An ambition to reduce teachers' and leaders' working hours by 5 hours a week within 3 years
- Involving unions, LGA, NGA, trust leaders, sector bodies
- The Taskforce has published initial recommendations: click on document
- The full findings will be published in March 2024.

Some of the recommendations

- Removal of Performance Related pay from STPCD 2024
- List of admin tasks Teachers should not be required to carry out as annex in STPCD 2024

- Drive sign up to the education staff wellbeing charter
- re-publish the 'Clarification for Schools' document as a separate document, to include re-emphasising what is not required around marking
- Schools may want to consider using INSET time to look at addressing workload issues marking, planning and data
- DfE should commit to enhancing knowledge and accessibility of the School Workload Reduction Toolkit. -
